Classical Corner:

"So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three, but the greatest of these is love." So St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13:13, the last verse of what is sometimes called "The chapter of love." In that chapter, St. Paul expounds on the virtue of love, highlighting how our love toward others flows from the love that God has for us. St. John writes the same in 1 John 3:1124 and 4:7-21 and even highlights how God is love, and it is from God that we know what love really is. "B\y As he. Faith and hope mature into "knowledge" when the thing believed in or hoped for is reached. As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 13:12, "For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known." Love does not turn into something else, but when it is mature, it remains love. While faith and hope have to do specifically with God, love is directly outward to God and to our others. Indeed, when Jesus is asked which is the greatest commandment, He responded, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22:37-40).

A classical Lutheran education pursues this sort of godly love defined by God's Word, received through faith in Christ, and lived out in relationships with one another. We seek to love our children and teach them to love in return, and importantly, to love the right things. To summarize St. Augustine, our goal is to order the heart rightly in love – to love the right thing to the right degree in the right way with the right kind of love. This love for God and others, and for this greatest of all the Christian virtues.


ANNOUNCEMENTS:
