Parents and Families,

In the October edition of our ZLS newsletter, I began a series titled *In the Home*, in which I reflected on the great gift of the home and family life. I discussed the wonderful estate of marriage and God's gift of children and how the home - not career, entertainment, or other worldly priorities - is central to life.

In the next three parts of this series, I will discuss the different God-given roles of the family that help our homes flourish. In the Bible, the apostles lay out an explanation of each family member's roles in several places. The apostles describe the role of wives, husbands, fathers, mothers, children, slaves, and masters. These are the 7 basic roles in the family. Every other role (brother, aunt, grandma, etc) grows out of one of these basic roles. Because marriage is the foundation of the home, this article will focus on the roles of husband and wife. When a marriage is grounded in obedience to these roles, the home will more easily function according to God's design.

An early Christian pastor, St. John Chrysostom, preached beautiful and edifying sermons on marriage and family on Ephesians 5 and 6 (Homilies 20 and 21). They are packed with wisdom and clarity about our roles in marriage and have helped me consider the roles of husband and wife in my own life and in preparing this article.

In Ephesians 5, Colossians 3, and 1 Peter 3 the apostles explain the roles of husbands and wives. I would encourage you to read these passages and you will see the basic roles described: "Wives, submit to your husbands" and "Husbands, love your wives."

Wives are called to submit to their husbands. This means the wife is called to respect her husband's authority and subordinate her will to his. This is not a popular teaching today. Because of widespread feminism, the biblical duty of submission is mocked and slandered, but the wisdom of the world is foolish compared to the goodness of God's Word. Submission is a gift from God, a blessing that benefits a wife's husband and herself. Scripture teaches that the husband's whole orientation should be for his wife's good; therefore, when she willingly submits to him, she strengthens and encourages his God-given role to serve and bless her. This is God's beautiful and perfect design.

Of course no husband loves perfectly at all times. Yet even in his failures, a wife's faithful submission encourages him toward repentance and renewed love. Competing for his position as head only creates conflict and disorder. Subordination will not always be easy (especially in a world that urges women to complete independence), but God will bless and strengthen all wives who submit to their husbands, and He will give them joy as they beautifully reflect our Lord's own bride, the Church.

The husband is called to love his wife. Today, this role is usually carried out in weakness and a misunderstanding of love as if love is about being nice or obeying one's wife. However, biblical love is revealed in Christ. A husband's love must be strong, sacrificial, and oriented toward what truly benefits his wife. He must discern what she truly needs, even in ways she herself may not fully realize. His love must provide, protect, and work for her long-term good. He must recognize her differences, be gentle with her, and care for her tenderly. This is a tall and noble calling. And just as Christ worked and suffered quietly for his wife, the Church, so husbands are called to labor and sacrifice for their wives. As Christ loved his church and suffered for her and always keeps her eternal happiness before him, so the good husband loves his wife, sacrifices for her, and always holds before him her temporary and eternal well-being.

Chrysostom beautifully encourages husbands in his homily on Ephesians 5:

You have seen the measure of obedience, hear also the measure of love. Would you have your wife obedient unto you, as the Church is to Christ? Take then yourself the same provident care for her, as Christ takes for the Church. Yea, even if it shall be needful for you to give your life for her, yea, and to be cut into pieces ten thousand times, yea, and to endure and undergo any suffering whatever—refuse it not. Though you should undergo all this, yet will you not, no, not even then, have done anything like Christ. For thou indeed art doing it for one to whom you are already knit; but He for one who turned her back on Him and hated Him. In the same way then as He laid at His feet her who turned her back on Him, who hated, and spurned, and disdained Him, not by menaces, nor by violence, nor by terror, nor by anything else of the kind, but by his unwearied affection; so also do thou behave yourself toward your wife. Yea, though thou see her looking down upon you, and disdaining, and scorning you, yet by your great thoughtfulness for her, by affection, by kindness, you will be able to lay her at your feet. For there is nothing more powerful to sway than these bonds, and especially for husband and wife..."

What refreshing and comforting wisdom the Holy Spirit gives in the Scriptures. May the Lord bless you in your own families and marriages as you live out these roles in service to our Lord Jesus Christ, the God of all comfort and life. Thanks be to God for giving us different roles through which we bless our spouses and glorify the name of our Lord. Amen.

NUNTIUS - ANNOUNCEMENTS:

2026-27 Enrollment for ZLS:

- Next year Zion Lutheran School will be **Kindergarten 11th grade**: Our school board has recently approved adding both 10th and 11th grade next year as we continue moving toward a full K–12 grade for ZLS.
- Next year Zion Lutheran School will offer a **3 day Bridge Program** that includes Science. There will be more information provided at the beginning of January 2026, as we prepare for next year's enrollment in February. If you have any immediate questions, feedback or concerns, please contact Mr. Swigart before or after school, or via email at zlsheadmaster@gmail.com.
- **ZLS Updated Tardy Policy:** (Approved 11/19/2025) Begins January 5th, 2026
- Students must be in their classroom by 7:55 a.m. Arrival in the classroom at 7:55 or later is considered tardy. Students arriving after 8:15 a.m. receive an unexcused absence. A tardy will also be issued when a student arrives at school without required daily materials. Parents should notify the office by 7:50 a.m. if their child will be tardy. Excused tardies include emergencies, pre-arranged medical appointments, and inclement weather with a parent note or call. All other tardies without headmaster approval are unexcused. Three tardies equal one unexcused absence. Tardies reset after each quarter.
- Consequences are as follows.
 - 1+ tardies: an email is sent home from the front office including the tardy policy.
 - 5–6 tardies: a \$10 charge is applied to the family's FACTS account.
 - 7–8 tardies: a \$25 charge is applied to the FACTS account.
 - 9 or more tardies: a \$50 charge is applied, and enrollment is reviewed by the headmaster and school board.
- Further details appear in Appendix A. Tardies, absences, and consequences for them may be adjusted at the headmaster's discretion. These expectations support an orderly and prepared start to each school day.
- **ZLS updated Delinquency Policy** (Approved 11/19/2025):

A letter will be emailed and physically sent notifying the family of the delinquency and the following procedures. Upon each new delinquency, the process would begin again. Delinquencies include Tuition, Incidentals or Hot Lunch Program Delinquencies.

- 1. Upon Delinquency Reported in FACTS: No usage of After School Care.
- 2. Upon 5 days delinquent: FACTS late fee is applied of \$25.
- 3. Upon 15 days delinquent: FACTS late fee of \$100 is applied.
- 4. Upon 30 days delinquent: The students are suspended from ZLS and may attend school upon payment of delinquency.

• School Choice Information

- The Idaho Parental Choice Tax Credit Program, enacted by the Legislature in House Bill 93, is a new refundable tax credit that provides funds to parents to help pay for eligible private school expenses. The program is available for Idaho K–12 students ages 5–18. Applications open January 15 and can be submitted at: https://myschoolchoice.idaho.gov/
- If you plan to apply, the Idaho Tax Commission recommends setting up your TAP account starting December 1, to ensure time for processing at: https://idahotap.gentax.com/tap/_/
- Families may be eligible to receive an advance voucher to help pay for tuition before the school year begins. Because funding is limited, we encourage every family to begin the application process promptly on January 15, 2026.

• Inclement Weather Procedure

- As the winter weather arrives, we would like to remind parents that any school closures due to inclement weather will be communicated by 7 am on Remind.
- We use the Nampa School District as a guide when determining closures. If you do not receive regular Remind or SMS messages, please stop by the office to get set up with Remind.

• Updated (December 2025) Hot Lunch Program Menu

- The December 2025 Hot Lunch Program menu has changed, due to an unforeseen Kitchen /HLP staff family member surgery. The 4 days affected are December 10th, 15th, 16th, and 17th. An updated menu will be sent out with the December 5th, newsletter, and it will be posted on the ZLS website.




EVENTUS - SCHOOL EVENTS


