From the Headmaster:

Children are known for thinking about temporary things and not the future. They run outside to play in the snow without grabbing a coat. They forget to tie their shoes and trip on the sidewalk. They scarf down ice cream and get a brain freeze. They do not invest well in the future!

Adults are much better at thinking long term. We stock up on food in case of shortages. We get the oil changed in our cars so they will last. We exercise now to feel better later. We invest in the stock market for retirement. And although many adults fail at these, we know that this future investment is a mark of maturity.

But even these "long-term" investments - food, cars, exercise and money - will not last. In fact, nothing that we can see will last! No food, no cars, no money. Everything visible in this world will either be destroyed or changed at the coming of Jesus Christ.

The Apostle Peter writes about what Christians have to look forward to:

God ...has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

Eternal things are waiting for us. So invest in these eternal things. The earthly things only matter if they serve the eternal. Even "mature" adults who invest in material things are childish without eternal life. As Jesus preached: "Make friends for yourselves by unrighteous mammon, that when you fail, they may receive you into an everlasting home."

The reason we have a school is to help lead young ones to eternal life. That is our entire goal. This year, we will direct your children to eternal things; things that will last them not just through high school or into their career, but will last to the resurrection of the body and the life of the world to come!
