#### The Mission of Zion Lutheran School – Part 3: Vocation

The third aspect of our mission at Zion—and my second article on the Christian life—is vocation. Our vocations are not only our careers but include all the God-given roles we have in life. These are the everyday ways God calls us to serve our neighbor.

As Luther's Small Catechism lays out, there are roughly thirteen primary vocations:

Vocations in the Church - Christian (church member), Pastor

Vocations in the Family - Wife, Husband, Mother, Father, Child, Widow

<u>Vocations in the State</u> - Citizen, Neighbor, Government Official, Worker (under authority), Supervisor (has authority)

A lot could be said about these thirteen vocations, but I'll highlight just four key things here:

1. God gives these vocations in everyday ways—not through inner voices or signs.

He calls a man and woman into marriage through vows and the pronouncement, "I now pronounce you husband and wife." He calls a woman into motherhood when she becomes pregnant and gives birth. Everyone is given the vocation of child simply by being born to parents. This gives us confidence that we are serving God even in normal, everyday tasks!

2. Each vocation has a God-given purpose.

Christians often wonder, "Am I living the way God wants me to?" To answer this question, look at your vocations. Are you living faithfully in the roles He's given you? The purpose of our lives isn't for us to define—God defines it. If a child wonders what his purpose in life is, Scripture gives him an answer: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother...'

(Ephesians 6:1–3)

3. God reveals the purpose of each vocation in nature and Scripture.

First, God designed our bodies and souls for these roles. A woman's body and soul are uniquely created for nurturing children in a way a father is obviously not. So nurturing ought to be her focus. While fathers can help nurture, they are uniquely designed as protectors and leaders.

Second, Scripture clarifies the purpose of each vocation. For example, fathers are told to: "Bring [children] up in the training and admonition of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4) So fathers are to protect, lead, *and* teach the faith. Scripture also teaches wives to respect and submit to their husbands, husbands to love their wives, children to obey parents, slaves (workers) to obey their masters, and masters (supervisors) to treat their workers fairly. 4. Vocations fall into three God-given estates: Church, Family, and State.

These three estates are institutions God established for our good. They are also prioritized:

First is the Church—because it is eternal.

Then the Family—as the foundation of earthly life.

Then the State—which promotes good in society.

Because of this, fellow believers in Christ are our highest priority, then our families, and then our communities and country (Keep in mind that your family members may also be part of your church).

These estates help us rightly order our lives. Today, many people elevate their jobs above all else—as if the workplace were a fourth estate or sacred calling of its own. But our jobs are a means to support our families and churches, and part of our role as citizens. A career is not an estate in itself. Understanding this will help us prioritize what truly matters.

Praise be to God for calling us into these wonderful roles. They truly are a blessing!

#### MEET REV. SEAN RIPPY!

We would like to say a heartfelt thank-you and welcome back to Rev. Sean Rippy!

Pastor Rippy is a familiar face to some of our staff and families who have been with Zion Lutheran School over the years. This is the second time that Pastor Rippy has served at ZLS. In 2013, he was one of several key staff members that paved the way to transition the school from a secular curriculum to a classical curriculum. He also served as ZLS's principal from 2013-2015. He returned during 2024-25 as a part time paid and volunteer teacher in Logic and Literature for our 5th - 7th grade students. He also blessed us by leading the morning Matins service at least once a week. Starting in 2025-26, Pastor Rippy will serve as the home room teacher for the 7th - 9th grades, and teach Theology and Latin to the 5th - 9th grade students.

In 1972, Pastor Rippy was born in Massachusetts to Gerald and Karolyn Rippy. His father was in the Army, so he grew up wherever his Dad was stationed. Those areas were Germany, El Paso, TX and Yakima Valley, WA. He attended Concordia College Portland and received a Bachelors in Theological Studies. Pastor Rippy's love for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ began at his Baptism and has continued ever since.
